No. 9/8 Ohio State vs. No. 25 Wisconsin Game Notes

Buckeyes and Badgers, both 2-0, will battle for first place in Big Ten Saturday at 3:30 p.m.

FIRST AND 10

- This will be the 75th meeting between these Big Ten conference opponents
- Ohio State leads the all-time series with Wisconsin, 52-17-5
- Coach Jim Tressel is 87-20 in 9 seasons at Ohio State; 222-77-2 in his 24th season overall
- The Illinois win was the 500th for the Tressel family as head coaches, second only to the Bowdens
- Ohio State's defense has allowed 13, 82 and 18 yards rushing over the last three games, an average of 37.6/ypg
- The TD catch by Zach Boren at IU was the first TD catch by a Buckeye fullback since 2001
- RB Brandon Saine rushed for a career-high 113 yards at Indiana Saturday
- Ohio State has won 4 Big Ten titles in a row, won at least 10 games in each of the last four years, played in the national championship game twice and two other BCS bowls
- Crowds of more than 100,000 have seen the last 51 games at Ohio Stadium
- Forty former Buckeyes were on 2009 NFL opening-day rosters

WISCONSIN AT A GLANCE


The Badgers are one of the hottest teams in the Big Ten at 5-0 and 2-0 in the Big Ten. This week they cracked the Top 25 for the first time this season, ranked 25th in the coaches and Harris polls and one spot outside the rankings in the AP poll. Wisconsin has posted wins over NIU (28-20), Fresno State (34-31 ot), Wofford (44-14), Michigan State (38-30) and at Minnesota last Saturday (31-28).

The Badgers rank first in the Big Ten in scoring (35.0 ppg), rushing (217 ypg), pass efficiency (153.0), 3rd down conversions (56.2), red zone efficiency (20-for-20) and are second in total offense with 433.2 yards per game.

Running back John Clay leads the Big Ten in rushing with 116.4 yards per game while quarterback Scott Tolzien ranks first in passer efficiency with a 154.6 rating. Garrett Graham (23 rec, 268 yards, 4 TD) and Nick Toon (22 rec, 269 yards, 2 TD) are the team's leading receivers.

Bret Bielema is in his fourth year as head coach of the Badgers with a 33-11 record overall, including a 17-9 mark in Big Ten play.

SERIES RECORD

The series between the Buckeyes and the Badgers, which dates back to 1913, shows Ohio State with a 52-17-5 lead. In games played in Columbus, the Buckeyes lead 28-7-3. In games played in Madison, the Buckeyes lead 24-10-2. Ohio State has a 7-5-1 advantage over the last 13 meetings (back through 1980). The Buckeyes have won the last two meetings between the squads.

Since joining the Big Ten Conference in 1913, Ohio State is 452-189-28 all-time in Big Ten games, and 256-112-18 in conference home games. The Buckeyes' all-time conference win percentage of 69.6% is the best of any Big Ten school.

AGAINST RANKED TEAMS

Ohio State is 127-104-12 all-time when facing a ranked opponent, and 39-41-7 on the road against ranked teams. Under Coach Jim Tressel, the Buckeyes are 33-13 overall and 12-6 on the road against ranked teams.

BIG TEN ROAD TRIPS

The Buckeyes currently hold a 16-game win streak in Big Ten road games. That's the longest such string ever by an Ohio State football team. The conference record is 17 games, set by Michigan between 1988-92.

SILVER BULLETS

Ohio State's defensive squads have held opponents to fewer than 21 points 43 times since 2006, the best among FBS teams. The Buckeyes are 41-3 in those games. Ohio State's defense has allowed fewer than 10 points 22 times since the start of the 2006 season.

Ohio State ranks among the NCAA Top 15 in four categories in 2009: scoring defense (8th), total defense (9th), rushing defense (10th) and pass efficiency defense (15th).

The back-to-back shutouts of Toledo and Illinois were the first time since 1996 that the Buckeye defense recorded consecutive shutouts. In 1996, Ohio State whitewashed Minnesota (45-0 at home) and Illinois (48-0 at Illinois) in November of that season.

The last time Ohio State had two shutouts in a season was 1998, also against Toledo (49-0) and Illinois (41-0).

The 1973 and 1977 Ohio State squads each recorded four shutouts, a season record since WWII.

The Buckeye defense had a nine-quarter scoreless streak stopped at Indiana; the Buckeyes have allowed only three touchdowns over the past 15 quarters.

The 38-0 shutout of Toledo (which had averaged 42.5 points in its first two games) was the first by the Buckeyes since a 43-0 shutout of Youngstown State in the 2008 season opener and the fourth shutout of the Tressel era. The Buckeyes held the Rockets to just 210 total yards, only 13 of those on the ground.

Against the USC Trojans, Ohio State's defense did not allow a first down until the 13:15 mark of

the second quarter and held the Trojans to only 5 yards of total offense on their first three possessions. The previous week, USC totaled 620 yards of total offense against San Jose State.

THE RUN STOPPERS

Ranked tenth nationally in rushing defense, the Buckeyes are giving up just 83.4 yards per game on the ground this season, allowing just 2.7 yards per rush. OSU's opponents have scored only four rushing touchdowns in five games.

Over the last three contests, Ohio State has allowed just 13, 82 and 18 yards rushing vs. Toledo, Illinois and Indiana, an average of only 37.6 yards/game.

It has been 15 games since the Buckeye defense allowed a 100-yard individual rushing performance; that was by USC's Joe McKnight, who gained 105 yards on 12 carries in the 2008 meeting. Since the beginning of the 2005 season, the Buckeyes have allowed only seven 100-yard rushers during a span of 57 games.

FORCING TURNOVERS

The Buckeyes have forced 12 opponent turnovers through the first five games, an average of 2.4 per contest. Ohio State has forced eight interceptions and recovered four opponent fumbles; the Buckeyes also scored a defensive two-point PAT on a Brian Rolle pass interception and run-back versus Navy.

Three defenders – Brian Rolle, Lawrence Wilson and Jermale Hines – had interceptions against Illinois. The last time the Buckeyes had three interceptions in a game was Sept. 6, 2008, against Ohio.

TOTAL OFFENSE

After netting 222 yards of total offense against the Indiana Hoosiers, Terrelle Pryor eclipsed 3,000 yards for his career and moved into 21st place on Ohio State's all-time list with 3,094 yards, passing Antonio Pittman (2,945) and Carlos Snow (2,974). Pepe Pearson is 20th with 3,142 yards. Pryor needs 71 yards on the ground Saturday against Wisconsin to eclipse 1,000 for his career.

Pryor's 372 yards of total offense against Toledo marked a career high for the sophomore signal-caller, and the best total offense game of his career. His previous high was 232 against Penn State last season. The Toledo win was the first time an Ohio State player had 300+ yards of total offense since Troy Smith had 328 against Michigan in 2006. Pryor's performance was the fifth best total offense game in OSU history.

Against the Rockets, Pryor recorded career highs with 17 completions, 27 attempts and 262 yards. He also rushed 12 times for 110 yards, including a career-long 43-yarder in the third quarter. It was the second 100-yard rushing game of his career; he rushed for 110 yards at Illinois last season.

"BOOM" TD STREAK REACHES EIGHT

Sophomore tailback Dan "Boom" Herron has scored at least one touchdown in eight consecutive games dating to last season. In his last six games he has rushed for 343 yards with eight touchdowns on 77 carries -- an average of 4.45 yards per carry. He did not play at Indiana.

SCORE BY QUARTERS

This season in the first quarter, the Buckeyes have outscored the opposition 44-14. In the second quarter, the Buckeyes are ahead 47-10, and Ohio State holds a 24-7 advantage in third-quarter scoring. Ohio State has outscored its 2009 opponents 32-28 in fourth-quarter play.

Ohio State has held the opposition scoreless in 12 quarters this year (60%).

The Buckeyes are outscoring opponents by 17.6 points per game (29.4-11.8) this season.

OHIO STATE CAPTAINS

Seniors Kurt Coleman, Austin Spitler and Doug Worthington were elected as 2009 captains of the Ohio State football team. An offensive game captain will be selected each week.

Jim Cordle served as captain against Navy and Jake Ballard was the fourth captain for the USC contest. Bryant Browning was offensive captain for Toledo, and Dane Sanzenbacher was captain for Illinois. Brandon Saine and Dexter Larimore

BUCKS WIN 77 PERCENT OF OHIO STADIUM GAMES

The Buckeyes boast an all-time record of 387-107-20 (.772) in Ohio Stadium since that facility opened in 1922.

The crowd of 106,033 against Southern California was the largest ever to watch a game at Ohio Stadium, besting last year's crowd of 105,711 against Penn State. The attendance of 105,092

against Navy was an opening day record for Ohio Stadium.

Ohio State has hosted 51 consecutive crowds of 100,000 or larger at Ohio Stadium; three of last year's crowds ranked among the top 10 all-time. Ohio State's all-time record in Columbus is 530-154-35 in 719 games.

FOR STARTERS

When the Ohio State-Wisconsin game kicks off, the Buckeyes will have a total of 36 players with at least one game of starting experience.

Those are: Anderson Russell (33); Kurt Coleman (28); Doug Worthington, Jim Cordle (27); Cameron Heyward (25); Bryant Browning, Chimdi Chekwa (18); Jake Ballard, Mike Brewster, Thaddeus Gibson, Terrelle Pryor (15); Ross Homan, Jermale Hines (11); Lawrence Wilson (9); Todd Denlinger, Dexter Larimore (8); Dane Sanzenbacher (7), Dan Herron, Justin Boren, Brian Rolle, DeVier Posey (6); Austin Spitler, Zach Boren, Rob Rose, Ray Small (4); Andrew Miller, J.B. Getting their first Ohio State start against Navy were six players: Andre Amos, Justin Boren, Zach Boren, Andrew Miller, DeVier Posey and Brian Rolle. Jake Stoneburner made his first start against USC. Devon Torrence, Duron Carter and J.B. Shugarts were first time starters vs. Toledo. Mike Adams was a first-time starter against Illinois.

The Boren brothers – Justin and Zach – products of Pickerington, Ohio, are the first siblings to start in the same game for the Buckeyes since John (LB) and Mike (NG) Sullivan from Mentor, Ohio, started nine games together during the 1988 season.

IN OCTOBER

The Buckeyes boast an all-time record of 357-125-28 in October games. Ohio State is 244-63-20 in October home games and 114-62-8 on the road that month.

Eleven members of the Buckeye roster have birthdays during October: Jordan Whiting, Joe Bauserman, Orhian Johnson, Grant Dziak, Dane Sanzenbacher, John Simon, Connor Smith, Nathan Williams, Thaddeus Gibson, Austin Spitler and J.B. Shugarts.

AVERAGE PER DOWN

Here's a breakdown of how the 2009 Ohio State offense is operating on first, second, third and fourth down.

On first down, the Buckeyes have run a total of 144 plays, gaining 874 yards for an average of 6.1 yards per play. On second down, OSU has tried 108 plays for 624 yards, a 5.8 average. On third down, the Buckeyes have run 63 plays, gaining 458 yards for a 7.3 average. Ohio State has tried only four fourth-down attempts, gaining 8 yards.

Ohio State's touchdowns this season have come three times on first down (two rushing and one passing TD), nine times on second down (three passing and six rushing), three times on third down (all passes) and once on a fourth-down pass.

FIRST IMPRESSIONS

Ten true freshmen have seen action for the Buckeyes in 2009. Seven Ohio State true freshmen made their first collegiate appearance in the opener against Navy: DB C.J. Barnett, FB Zach Boren, WR Duron Carter, TE Reid Fragel, FB Adam Homan, LB Storm Klein and DT John Simon. Tailback Jordan Hall, another true freshman, saw his first action against Toledo, and LB Jonathan Newsome played for the first time against Illinois. OL Marcus Hall played for the first time at Indiana.

ON SCHOLARSHIP

Three Ohio State seniors received scholarship aid for the 2009 autumn quarter that began Sept. 23: Marcus Williams, who is in physical therapy school; Andrew Moses, who is working toward a second bachelor's degree after earning his first in political science; and Jon Thoma, who is completing his degree in communication. Three additional seniors – Ryan Schuck, Joe Gantz and Tom Ingham – will receive scholarship aid for the winter quarter.

THE GRADUATES

Six members of the 2009 Buckeye squad have already earned their bachelor's degrees: Andrew Moses (political science), Aaron Pettrey (social and behavioral sciences), Anderson Russell (communication), Austin Spitler (communication), Marcus Williams (health sciences), Lawrence Wilson (communication). Nine more members of the team are expected to graduate following the autumn quarter.

HONOR ROLL

In 2008, 27 Buckeyes were named to the Big Ten's all-academic team; the Buckeyes have led the conference over the past seven years. Additionally, 46 Ohio State football players qualified for the annual OSU Scholar-Athlete Dinner in May, which requires a grade-point average of 3.00 or better for the past academic year.

the National Football Foundation and College Football Hall of Fame, was recognized at halftime of the Navy game. The four-year letterwinner (1984-87) and the winner of the 1987 Lombardi Award will be inducted at a ceremony in South Bend, Ind. in the summer of 2010.

Spielman, hailing from Massillon Washington High School, ranks third all-time in tackles (546) at Ohio State and first in solo stops (283). Perhaps the most notable performance by Spielman was his 29-tackle day against Michigan in 1986.

Tenacious and hard-hitting on the field, the linebacker is just as strong away from the field, as is his wife, Stefanie. In 1998, the couple learned that Stefanie had breast cancer. Despite the physical and emotional strain of dealing with such a

disease, and the unthinkable worries, the couple has been tireless advocates for cancer research and they have helped to raise millions to fight the disease.

After his playing days in Columbus, Spielman was drafted in the second round by Detroit in 1988 and went on to play for the Lions and Buffalo Bills before finishing up his career with the Cleveland Browns. The 12-year NFL veteran and four-time Pro Bowler then made the move to the broadcast booth where he is a college football analyst for ESPN and co-hosts The Big Show on WBNS radio in Columbus. He and Stefanie are the parents of four children.

OHIO STATE REPRESENTED AT JUNIOR WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

Buckeye freshmen Storm Klein (LB, Newark, Ohio) and Jack Mewhort (OL, Toledo, Ohio) spent three weeks this summer as part of USA Football's Junior National Team in the inaugural IFAF Junior World Championships held in Canton, Ohio. Team USA won the gold medal with wins over France (78-0), Mexico (55-0) and Canada (41-3) in the championship game. Klein (who was also a team captain) and Mewhort were both named to the all-tournament team.

IN NON-CONFERENCE GAMES

Under Jim Tressel, the Buckeyes are 24-2 at Ohio Stadium versus non-conference teams, the only loss coming to USC this season and 25-22 to No. 2 Texas in 2005. The Buckeyes are 29-4 overall in regular season non-conference games since 2001.

NOT SINCE 1922-24

Ohio State ranks second among all NCAA Div. I programs with 84 consecutive seasons since last posting back-to-back losing records. The Buckeyes have not been under .500 for two or more consecutive seasons since 1922-24, which trails only Tennessee; the Vols have not had back-to-back losing seasons since 1909-11, a span of 97 consecutive seasons.

During the Jim Tressel era at Ohio State, in the games following the Buckeyes' 17 losses, OSU has an 18-2 record. Twelve of those games were at Ohio Stadium, where the Buckeyes under Tressel are 11-1 in the game following a loss. Only once during the Tressel era has Ohio State recorded back-to-back losses, a three-game stretch with losses at Northwestern, to Wisconsin and at Iowa in October, 2004.



In his ninth season at Ohio State, Jim Tressel has elevated a storied program to even greater heights. Since taking over the Ohio State football program in 2001, Tressel has guided the Buckeyes to an 87-20 record, seven bowl appearances, five BCS games, six 10-win seasons, five Big Ten titles and a national championship.

The numbers are plentiful and impressive: five finishes in the Top 5, including the 2006 and 2007 squads that played for the national title; 4-4 in bowl games; 3-3 in BCS games; two streaks of 19 consecutive victories; and a 7-1 mark against Michigan in college football's most storied rivalry.

Since coming to Ohio State, Tressel is 32-13 against ranked teams and 8-8 against Top 10 opponents. He is a master in close games, posting a 4-1 record in overtime at OSU and 22-13 in games decided by a touchdown or less. He is 54-12 in Big Ten play (8-0 in 2006 when the Buckeyes captured their first outright conference title since 1984).

Eight of Tressel's players – center LeCharles Bentley (2001 Rimington), punter B.J. Sander (2003 Ray Guy), placekicker Mike Nugent (2004 Lou Groza), linebacker A. J. Hawk (2005 Lombardi), linebacker James Laurinaitis (2006 Nagurski, 2007 Butkus, 2008 Lott), cornerback Malcolm Jenkins (2008 Thorpe), defensive lineman Joel Penton (2006 Wuerffel) and quarterback Troy Smith (2006 Heisman, Davey O'Brien, Walter Camp) – have won major individual awards and 20 have earned first team All-America recognition.

Tressel's teams annually lead the Big Ten in academic all-conference picks. Craig Krenzle – a molecular genetics major – was the 2003 Academic All-American of the Year and received the Draddy Award; Brian Robiskie was a two-time first team CoSIDA Academic All-American. His coaching staff reflects his personality and shares his beliefs and values. It is a diverse group with a wide range of coaching experience and expertise. More than anything else, however, it is a group dedicated to the well-being of Ohio State's student-athletes.

Tressel was named as the Buckeyes' 22nd head coach on January 18, 2001. His original five-year contract was extended following the 2002 season; his current contract runs through 2012.

Prior to Ohio State, Tressel spent 15 seasons as the head coach at Youngstown State, winning four national championships and qualifying for the Division I-AA playoffs a remarkable 10 times. During his stay at YSU (where he also served as athletic director), he compiled an overall record of 135-57-2 and was a four-time pick as the Division I-AA National Coach of the Year.

OHIO STADIUM • “THE HORSESHOE”



Ohio Stadium, home to Ohio State football since 1922, recently underwent upgrades for the upcoming 2009 season. This year “The Horseshoe” will present fans with new signage displays and scoreboards in the north endzone and on the east and west fascias of the stadium’s C-Deck.

For the first time in the stadium’s history, the scoreboard in the north endzone offers fans a video screen. At 17-feet-by-44-feet, the LED board offers fans replays and other game-day features typically only seen on the video board in the south endzone.

The ribbon boards on the east and west side have been replaced and expanded to reach endzone-to-endzone and feature an improved LED display.

In addition to the new boards, tribute signage for Ohio State’s seven national championship teams (1942, ‘54, ‘57, ‘61, ‘68, ‘70, 2002) is on display near the new scoreboard in the north endzone, accenting the seven currently retired Ohio State jersey numbers of Chic Harley (17), Les Horvath (22), Eddie George (27), Vic Janowicz (31), Howard “Hopalong” Cassady (40), Bill Willis (99) and Archie Griffin (45) also displayed on the north end.

As a result of the expanded ribbon boards, the Woody Hayes tribute signage has been moved to the SE corner of the C-Deck. All three signage areas are backlit for more prominent display during primetime telecasts.

LAST TIME AGAINST WISCONSIN

Pryor, Wells Rally Buckeyes Past Badgers on Final Drive

Wells runs for 168 yards and a touchdown in the victory

MADISON, Wis. – Terrelle Pryor ran for an 11-yard touchdown with 1:08 left, and Chris “Beanie” Wells had 168 yards rushing and a score, lifting the 14th-ranked Buckeyes to a 20-17 victory over No. 18 Wisconsin on Saturday.

“Guys really don’t know who to key on, me or Terrelle,” Wells said. “I like that about our offense, having two guys out there who can really run the ball.”

“All the hype, and all the people saying, ‘You’re great,’ this is the time to show it,” Pryor said.

The 19-year-old Pryor sure did, leading Ohio State on two fourth-quarter scoring drives and snapping a 16-game home winning streak for the Badgers (3-2, 0-2). He also helped his coach, Jim Tressel, even his record at 3-3 against Wisconsin.

“Every snap he gets, he learns from. He was under duress tonight,” said Tressel, after his first game in Madison in five years. “They were playing hard, they were coming after him, they were going to make him do things with lots of people in his face and he’s coming of age.”

Pryor did it on the game-winning drive through the air and on the ground, and before the possession he got an earful from Wells on the sideline.

“I told him, ‘It’s a man’s world right now, and he’s taking a step into manhood right now,’” said Wells. “He said he was ready.”

Trailing 17-13, Pryor twice found trusted receiver Brian Hartline for big gains, even though Hartline fumbled on the second completion for 27 yards and needed teammate Brian Robiske’s recovery to keep possession at the Wisconsin 35.

Wells, who has been wearing a lineman’s shoe to protect his injured foot, gained 13 more yards on three carries, and Pryor added another first down on a third-and-1 sneak from the 15 with under 2 minutes to play.

“Pryor and Wells are two good players. We knew they were going to get their yards,” linebacker Jaeverly McFadden said. “We contained them pretty well until that last drive, then we just let it get away and it hurts.”

Pryor, who finished 13-of-19 with 144 yards passing and an interception, ran an option with Wells flared out wide, but he chose to keep it himself and reached the end zone after Wisconsin’s defense looked confused by the formation.

“At times we did some good things, but he’s elusive, he presents a challenge,” Wisconsin coach Bret Bielema said. “In the end on the last play we weren’t good enough.”

McFadden said Ohio State’s late substitution confused the Badgers’ defense, and Tressel was aware what was happening from the Buckeyes’ sideline.

“They didn’t get lined up, and we were saying, ‘Snap it! Snap it!’ because there wasn’t anyone lined up over there,” Tressel said.

Wisconsin quarterback Allan Evridge, who needed to play efficiently to give the Badgers a chance, committed his second turnover when Malcolm Jenkins intercepted a pass to seal the game with 53 seconds left.

Pryor made his share of head-scratching freshman plays and refused to throw a pass away under pressure, taking four sacks and numerous hits. But he moved the Buckeyes in position to take its first lead since the first half, settling for Ryan Pretorius’ 34-yard field goal with just under 11 minutes to play to make it 13-10.

Wisconsin, needing to rebound after a demoralizing loss to Michigan, answered with a quick drive capped on third-and-goal from the 1 when P.J. Hill powered through linebacker Ross Homan to give Wisconsin a 17-13 lead.

That set the stage for Pryor, who snapped the Badgers’ 11-game winning streak at night and handed them their first lose at Camp Randall Stadium since Nov. 12, 2005, against Iowa.

LAST TIME AGAINST UW IN COLUMBUS

Big Fourth Quarter Helps Ohio State Pull Away From UW

Ohio State's Wells runs for 169 yards and three touchdowns in the victory to help the Buckeyes remain unbeaten

COLUMBUS, Ohio -- In a back-and-forth slugfest between two Big Ten teams known for their muscle, No. 1 Ohio State came from behind to defeat No. 19 Wisconsin, 31-17.

Chris "Beanie" Wells rushed for 169 yards and scored the tying, go-ahead and game-clinching touchdowns in the second half to lead Ohio State's offense. Todd Boeckman and Brian Robiskie teamed for two touchdown pass plays and James Laurinaitis and Vernon Gholston led the defense that allowed just 281 yards. Laurinaitis recorded a career-high 19 tackles and a key fourth-down stop in the second half while Gholston tied a school record with four quarterback sacks.

The Badgers were led by quarterback Tyler Donovan, who passed for 238 yards and two touchdowns. Travis Beckum caught nine passes for 140 yards and one touchdown.

Ohio State took a 7-0 lead on its first series as Boeckman led a seven-play, 71-yard march that was finalized by a terrific athletic effort by Robiskie. After catching a short pass over the middle, Robiskie spun around to elude a Wisconsin defender, used a hand on the ground to keep from falling and then sped into the right corner of the end zone for his team-leading ninth touchdown of the season.

Despite being a heavy underdog, Wisconsin was the first team to come into Ohio Stadium ready for a fight to the finish. The Badgers showed bite on their first drive by converting on a 31-yard fake punt to set up a 21-yard field goal by Taylor Mehlhaff that made the score 7-3.

The score stayed this way until inside of a minute to play in the half. Boeckman hit Brian Hartline, who had career highs of seven receptions for 95 yards, on a 45-yard gainer over the middle with 48 seconds remaining. Ryan Pretorius kicked a 27-yard field goal just before the half for a 10-3 Ohio State lead.

Then came the second half, one as entertaining and stressful for Buckeyes fans as any half all season. The Badgers opened with back-to-back scoring drives to take a 17-10 lead. The first score was set up by a Donovan-to-Beckum completion on third-and-16 for 46 yards, giving the Badgers a first down at the OSU 13. After a 15-yard illegal block penalty moved Wisconsin back to the 28, Donovan fired a laser into the end zone that Beckum caught for a touchdown to tie the game at 10-all. The score was the first offensive touchdown against Ohio State at home all season.

After an Ohio State punt, Donovan led the Badgers on an 8-play, 62-yard drive that culminated in a Donovan-to-Chris Pressley 2-yard touchdown pass and a 17-10 lead for the Badgers.

Pressed into a corner this late in a game for the first time this season, the Buckeyes came back determined and focused. The team marched 80 yards in 10 plays to tie the score with 2:41 to play in the third quarter. Beanie Wells burst over left guard to score from 31 yards for the tying touchdown.

After Ohio State forced a Badger punt on the next series, Wells and the Buckeyes came right back to take a 24-17 lead. Wells scored on a similar play over left guard, this time at the north end of the stadium and from 30 yards away.

It was hard to know whether it was planned or not because the blocking didn't seem to be there, but Wisconsin then tried another fake punt on fourth-and-3 from its own 27. It didn't work. Laurinaitis stopped punter Ken DeBauche for a 2-yard loss and like a champion, Ohio State capitalized. Boeckman found Robiskie from 8-yards out for another touchdown and a 31-17 Ohio State lead.

Dexter Larimore recovered a fumble on the next UW series and Wells went 23 yards one play later for the clinching touchdown.

The Ohio State defense may have finally allowed a touchdown at home, but it was solid when it needed to be. Five first-half sacks and nine for the game kept the Badgers in check. So did an impressive second-quarter defensive effort that gave up just 13 total yards while Ohio State's offense was unable to extend its lead.

No. 6/6 Ohio State Opens 2009 With 31-27 Win Over Navy

Buckeyes hold on for Tressel's 14th-consecutive season-opening win

COLUMBUS, Ohio - The No. 6 Ohio State Buckeyes hosted the U.S. Naval Academy for the first time in 78 years to open the 2009 season, with the Buckeyes coming out of the hard-fought game with a 31-27 win before an opening game record crowd of 105,092 in Ohio Stadium.

Navy, which had trailed by as many as 13, drew to within two points with 2:23 remaining in the fourth quarter on a 24-yard touchdown run following an interception. Buckeye junior Brian Rolle, who tied for the team lead with a career-best nine tackles, intercepted the 2-point attempt and ran it back for two points to give the Buckeyes a four-point lead (31-27).

The final statistics were virtually equal, with 363 total yards for Ohio State and 342 for Navy. Buckeye quarterback Terrelle Pryor ended the day 14-for-21 for 174 yards and one touchdown and also rushed for a TD. Dan Herron was the leading rusher with 72 yards, including a touchdown, on 17 carries, along with 29 receiving yards on four catches. Brandon Saine had nine rushes for 53 yards for Ohio State. Kurt Coleman was the team co-leader with nine tackles and also had an interception.


For Navy, quarterback Ricky Dobbs accounted for all four touchdowns, with two passing and two rushing. He was 9-for-13 through the air and had 18 rushes for 83 yards on the ground. Marcus Curry led the Midshipmen with 101 yards receiving on just two catches, converting both for TDs.

The home team and the home crowd made a point of paying much respect to one of our nation's service academies with a dignified lead-up to the game that included a patriotic game program, a team handshake line, both teams coming onto the field at the same time, a military flyover featuring three F/A 18Ds and former astronaut and Senator John Glenn ceremoniously "dotting the I" at halftime during the Marching Band's incomparable Script Ohio.

Less than three minutes into the game, Pryor hit Dane Sanzenbacher over the middle for a 38-yard touchdown pass and a quick 7-0 lead on Ohio State's opening drive.

Back came Navy, the nation's best rushing team the past four years running, with a 15-play (14 rushes) drive that covered 80 yards. Quarterback Ricky Dobbs scooted the last 16 yards for the tying score.

Trailing 10-7 after an Aaron Pettrey field goal (the first of three on the day for the senior), Navy took its second possession early in the second quarter at about the 50. Dobbs fumbled, however, and Ross Homan recovered the ball for the Buckeyes. Pryor marched the team down the field, including another big hook-up with Sanzenbacher (19 yards), and ended up scoring



from the 2 for a 17-7 Ohio State lead.

A 25-yard Pettrey field goal just before half-time extended Ohio State's lead to 20-7.

After a halftime that included quadruple Script Ohios and a tribute to Chris Spielman for his selection into the College Football Hall of Fame, Navy struck first in the second half. Dobbs ate up most of the third quarter by directing a 15-play, 99-yard drive that took 8:38 off the clock. Dobbs hit Marcus Curry for a 16-yard touchdown pass to close the gap to 20-14.

Pettrey gave the Buckeyes some breathing room moments later, converting on a 52-yard field goal - his fifth career of 50+ yards - for a 23-14 Ohio State lead.

Navy fumbled on its next possession and Ohio State quickly drove 30 yards in three plays with Dan "Boom" Herron going in from the 6 for a 29-14 Buckeye lead. Pettrey's extra point attempt hit the right goal post and was no good.

After Ohio State turned the ball over on downs, the Mids pulled within eight when Marcus Curry ran a Dobbs pass 85 yards to the end zone, the third-longest pass play in school history. On the ensuing drive Navy's Emmett Merchant picked off a Pryor pass and started the drive at the OSU 33. After two plays, Dobbs kept the ball on third-and-5 and ran 24 yards for a TD to cut the score to 29-27.

Navy went for the two-point conversion, but Rolle picked off the attempt on the 1 and returned it 99 yards for two points, giving Ohio State a 31-27 lead with 2:23 left. Navy attempted an onside kick but the ball went out of bounds at the Navy 44. After two rushing plays, including an 18-yard Herron run, Ohio State ran out the clock to secure the season-opening win.

No. 8/7 Ohio State Edged by No. 3/3 USC in Fourth Quarter

Come-from-behind win played in front of Ohio Stadium record crowd of 106,033

COLUMBUS, Ohio - No. 3 USC came from behind in the fourth quarter to hand No. 8/7 Ohio State an 18-15 defeat before an Ohio Stadium record crowd of 106,033.

The Buckeyes led 15-10 heading into the final quarter, but a Stafon Johnson touchdown with 1:05 remaining put the Trojans on top and Ohio State was unable to piece together a comeback in the final seconds.

The game, televised in standard, high and three-dimensional definition, was electric from the start and had the feel of a title matchup between two heavyweights. And that is what it was.

At the end of the day Ohio State had 265 yards of total offense, with Terrelle Pryor going 11-for-25 for 177 yards. DeVier Posey had six catches for 81 yards, with Dane Sanzenbacher hauling down two passes for 58 yards, including a career-best 56-yard grab. Dan Herron was the workhorse on the ground, with 18 carries for 44 yards. Pryor rushed for 36 yards on 10 carries.

Defensively, Ross Homan led the way with nine tackles, followed by Devon Torrence and Brian Rolle with eight each. Torrence's total was a career high.


USC freshman quarterback Matt Barkley was 15-for-31 for 195 yards on the day. Damian Williams had five catches for a team-high 51 yards. Joe McKnight had 16 carries for 60 yards, along with two catches for 45 yards, with Johnson running for 50 yards on 11 carries, reaching the end zone twice.

USC took an early 7-0 lead. Sophomore linebacker Chris Galippo intercepted Pryor's second pass of the game and returned it 51 yards to the OSU 2. On fourth down, Johnson bulled over from the 1 for a quick lead that quieted the huge Ohio State crowd ... but only momentarily.

Three consecutive runs by Dan Herron gave the Buckeyes some working space on OSU's second series before Pryor hit Dane Sanzenbacher on a slant pass over the middle for 56 yards down to the USC 3-yard line. Herron finished the drive off two plays later with a two-yard burst up the middle, tying the game at 7-all.

Near the end of the first quarter, and the first play after USC All-American safety Taylor Mays left the game with a leg issue (he would return), Pryor hit Posey in stride slanting over the middle for a 33-yard gain and a first down at the USC 2. An incompletion and two Herron runs could not produce a touchdown and Aaron Pettrey booted an 18-yard field goal for a 10-7 Buckeye lead.

Freshman quarterback Matt Barkley and USC controlled the second quarter, outgaining the Buckeyes by a 178-12 margin, but the Trojans could only net three points and a 10-all tie at halftime. Ross Homan intercepted Barkley to



stop one second-quarter USC drive that had reached the Ohio State 42. But the Buckeyes could not capitalize, going three and out before punting.

USC later marched to the Ohio State 26, but a 44-yard field goal attempt hit the cross bar and bounced away. After another three-and-out by Ohio State, Barkley marched the Trojans 77 yards in 48 seconds with Jordan Congdon connecting from 22 yards out for the game-tying field goal as the second-quarter clock read 00:00.

Ohio State struck first in the second half with a safety on USC's second possession for a 12-10 lead. Punter Billy O'Malley, the only Trojan from Ohio (Novelty; near Cleveland), could not bring down a high snap and the ball bounded into the end zone. The fourth-down play was set up after Thaddeus Gibson batted away a Barkley third-down pass and Doug Worthington pressured Barkley on second down.

A big 3rd-and-8 completion to Posey extended Ohio State's drive on the ensuing free kick, giving the Buckeyes a first-and-goal at the 10. The drive stalled, though, and Pettrey kicked a 22-yard field goal for a tenuous 15-10 lead.

In the fourth quarter, Ohio State opened with a nine-play, 27-yard drive that earned the Buckeyes a pair of first downs before Jon Thoma was forced to punt with 11:12 to play. The teams swapped possessions over the next few minutes, with the Trojans taking over control at their own 14-yard line at the 7:15 mark. Five first downs and 86 total yards later, Johnson used a 2-yard rush to give USC a 17-10 lead.

Choosing to go for a two-point conversion, Barkley passed to McKnight, who finished with a game-high 61 yards rushing, to stretch the lead to 18-15. The Buckeyes were unable to mount a comeback, going 4-and-out.

No. 11 Ohio State Blanks Toledo, 38-0

Buckeyes hold Rockets to 13 yards on the ground; Pryor 372 total yards

CLEVELAND, Ohio - Sophomore quarterback Terrelle Pryor threw for a career-high 262 yards and ran for 110 yards to help the Buckeyes rebound from a tough loss to USC last week and beat Toledo 38-0 on Saturday at Cleveland Browns Stadium.

"I'm just here to win," said Pryor, who threw three TD passes and ran for another score. "Whether it's 100 yards passing or 100 yards rushing ... it's not always realistic. Of course I want it, but I'll still do whatever I can to get a win."

It was a resounding response by the Buckeyes (2-1) a week after an 18-15 loss to No. 3 Southern California. Pryor and the Buckeyes got the confidence-boosting performance they needed.

Pryor set career bests in completions and attempts (17 for 28) and tossed TD passes of 76 yards and 18 yards to Dane Sanzenbacher on the Buckeyes' first two possessions to set the tone against a Toledo defense that came in giving up 45 points and almost 500 yards a game.

"I thought he threw the ball much better than he had in previous weeks," said Toledo (1-2) coach Tim Beckman, a former Ohio State assistant.

A decidedly pro-Buckeyes crowd of 71,727 roared its approval as their team steamrolled through the Rockets (1-2), who were hopeful of adding another big upset to their resume after tripping up Michigan 13-10 a year ago.

On third-and-7 from his own 24 on Ohio State's first possession, Pryor flipped a pass over the middle to a wide-open Sanzenbacher. He split the secondary and raced the distance.

Pryor -- who was hesitant to run and seldom threw longer than 10 yards in the first two games -- rushed for two first downs and passed 12 yards to Duron Carter for another the second time Ohio State had the ball. That helped set up a quick look-in pass to Sanzenbacher, who was sandwiched by defensive backs but pulled in the ball to make it 14-0.


Ohio State's defense held Toledo's Aaron Opelt, leading the nation in total offense with 437 yards a game, to 181 yards.

Opelt hit on 22 of 45 passes for 197 yards but was sacked twice, hurried 10 times and intercepted once.

Asked if he'd ever been shut out before, Opelt said, "If I did I'd remember, so I don't think so."

With Ohio State's front wall bearing down on Opelt, he had to throw the ball away on four of the Rockets' first six plays. It didn't get much better after that as they managed just 210 yards.

Dan Herron ran for a 4-yard score and DeVier Posey also caught a TD pass from Pryor, who had two interceptions.



The Buckeyes seemed committed to making the Rockets -- particularly Opelt -- miserable.

Early in the fourth quarter, Opelt hit Eric Page with a pass at the 6 but he was hit by Kurt Coleman and fumbled at the goal line, with linebacker Ross Homan recovering for a touchback.

It was that kind of a day for the Rockets.

No. 8/7 Ohio State Edged by No. 3/3 USC in Fourth Quarter

Come-from-behind win played in front of Ohio Stadium record crowd of 106,033

COLUMBUS, Ohio - Ohio State defeated Illinois, 30-0, to retain the Illibuck Trophy for another year as tailbacks Dan Herron and Brandon Saine combined to rush for 156 yards and the Ohio State defense forced three interceptions and limited the Illini to just 170 yards in marking the team's second-consecutive shutout -- the first back-to-back shutouts since 1996.

"When your defense can throw another shut-out, it makes it a heck of a lot more fun," Tressel said. "We talked all week about playing fast, especially on offense and defense, coming out and getting after it and also playing very focused. There was talk all week long about how bad the weather was going to be and all this and that and we continually talked about the fact we've got to be focused regardless of conditions, delays, lightning, six-hour game, whatever. We had to stay in it and I thought our kids really did a good job focusing. The run game was called upon when those conditions got horrible and I thought they delivered. In the second half we got to throw a little bit, but our defense was playing so well. I thought our kids came out of the gate in the Big Ten the way you should."


Illinois, 1-2 on the year, had won three of last four games in this series in Columbus, including a stunning 28-21 win over No. 1 ranked Ohio State in 2007. But on a gray, muggy day, Ohio State controlled the action despite just 82 passing yards. The team rushed for 236 yards to notch its third win of the season against just one defeat.

Saine rushed for 81 yards, two shy of his career best, and Herron rushed for 75 yards and two touchdowns. Both totals represented season highs. Terrelle Pryor added 59 rushing yards on a day where he threw just 13 times and completed eight for 82 yards and a late touchdown to Dane Sanzenbacher.

Juice Williams, who had led Illinois to 815 yards of offense in the past two games vs. Ohio State, managed just 77 passing yards and 18 yards rushing against a stout Ohio State defense that was led by Kurt Coleman with nine tackles, Brian Rolle with eight and Thaddeus Gibson and Doug Worthington with a career-high seven each. Rolle had an interception, along with Jermale Hines (the first of his career) and Lawrence Wilson (his first since Sept. 6, 2008 vs. Ohio). As a group, the defense had eight tackles for a total loss of 41 yards.

Ohio State led 13-0 at the half with all but a couple minutes of the half played in a driving rainstorm. Two Aaron Pettrey field goals put Ohio State in the lead, 6-0, and Herron scored from the 4 to cap an 80-yard drive to increase the lead to 13-0.

Illinois couldn't capitalize on a golden opportunity late in the half. A muffed punt gave the ball back to the Illini at the 45, and then a pass interference penalty moved the ball to the



30. But from there the Illini went backward and ended up punting with 36 seconds left to play.

Pettrey's first field goal was set up when junior middle linebacker Rolle, dropping back into a zone coverage, read the play perfectly and picked off Juice Williams early in the first quarter and returned it 39 yards to set Ohio State up with a first-and-10 at the Illinois 46. Five plays later Pettrey connected on his sixth career field goal from at least 50 yards, with this one from 50.

The steady rain throughout turned into a torrential downpour late in the first quarter as Ohio State took possession of the football on its own 8. Someone must have thought "torrential rain means Brandon Saine" because the junior's number was called and he delivered consecutive runs of 19, 5, 10, 13 and 12 yards to drive Ohio State to the Illinois 33. Pettrey delivered again when the drive ended, booting a 46-yarder through the rain drops for a 6-0 lead.

Two 15-yard penalties on Illinois helped Ohio State march 80 yards in six plays in just under three minutes. Herron carried the load on this drive, carrying five times for 34 yards, including the four-yard touchdown rush, his eighth-consecutive game with a touchdown.

A two-yard run by Dan Herron and a 27-yard Pettrey field goal increased the lead to 23-0 heading into the fourth quarter.

A Buckeye fumble as the game was winding down was recovered by the Illini. However, on the first pass of Illinois' drive Hines picked off an Eddie McGee pass, his first throw of the game, marking Hines' first career interception. The Buckeyes drove 42 yards on the ensuing possession, ending with Pryor connecting on a three-yard touchdown pass to Sanzenbacher with 1:18 remaining. Illinois had one last chance to break up the shutout, but Rob Rose sacked McGee for eight yards on the final play of the game.

No. 9 Ohio State Sprints Past Indiana, 33-14

Brandon Saine rushes for career-high 113 yards in the victory; Pryor 4 TD's

BLOOMINGTON, Ind. - Terrelle Pryor threw three touchdown passes, Brandon Saine rushed for 113 yards and the defense limited IU to 18 rushing yards to lead Ohio State to a 33-14 win over Indiana Saturday at Memorial Stadium. The win improved Ohio State's records to 4-1 overall and 2-0 in the Big Ten. Indiana drops its second in succession and is 3-2 and 0-2, respectively.

"It's good to get a Big Ten win on the road," Coach Jim Tressel said. "We made some big plays. Our defense played well once again against the rush and we'll need to be very good against the rush next week with Wisconsin coming in. I thought our defense did a good job of setting the tempo and setting us up with good field-position. We missed some chip shots and had a few turnovers in there, but now we get to go back home next week, get better and start preparing for Wisconsin."

Saine, making his first career start, had a career-high 17 carries for his career high rushing total. Additionally, Duron Carter and fullback Zach Boren each caught his first touchdown pass.

The Ohio State defense forced three turnovers and held the Hoosier offense to 228 total yards. Anderson Russell forced a fumble (recovered by Devon Torrence) and had an interception and lineman Todd Denlinger also had an interception. Rob Rose tackled IU punter Chris Hagerup in the end zone for a safety plus had two of the team's seven tackles behind the line of scrimmage.


This was a dedication game, of sorts. Indiana christened its renovated North End Zone Student-Athlete Development Center. The two-year addition to Memorial Stadium enclosed one side of the 52,000 seat stadium, making it somewhat of a mini horseshoe.

Ohio State finds horseshoe stadiums lucky, though, and the Scarlet and Gray led, 24-7, at the half behind three Pryor touchdown passes and 80 and 75 rushing yards by Saine and Pryor, respectively.

After Aaron Pettrey booted a 46-yard field goal to give OSU a quick 3-0 lead, the Buckeyes extended the lead to 10-0 with 7:29 to go in the first quarter. Pryor connected with Carter on a five-yard touchdown pass to cap an eight-play, 78-yard drive. A 30-yard burst around right end by Saine got the drive off to a good start. Pryor hit DeVier Posey for 15 yards on third down to extend it.

Indiana recovered from the deficit. Ben Chappell hit Tandon Doss with a 7-yard touchdown pass to cap a 80-yard drive and close the gap to 10-7 early in the second quarter.

A reverse on the following kickoff netted Ray Small 35 yards and set Ohio State up on the



Indiana 45. Three plays later the lead was 17-7. Pryor rushed for 14, hit Dane Sanzenbacher for 18 yards and then drilled a pass to Posey at the goal line for a 23-yard touchdown.

A second turnover of the half - Denlinger's interception of a Chappell pass at the line of scrimmage - set Ohio State up on the Indiana 38. Four plays later Pryor hit Boren with an eight-yard touchdown pass for a 24-7 lead.

Not a whole lot of action in the second half. Rose's safety was the only points of the third quarter. Then Rose nearly had a second safety. He sacked Chappell for a nine-yard loss to the IU 1 on the first play of the fourth quarter. Following the IU punt, Pryor capped a 41-yard drive with a one-yard quarterback sneak that made the score 33-7. Indiana scored its second touchdown of the game with no time left in the game.

Ohio State has now won 16 consecutive Big Ten Conference road games to get to within one of the conference mark of 17 held by Michigan. Ohio State has also won 15 consecutive games over Indiana and hasn't lost in Bloomington since the 1988 season.
